In each Trickster Residency we work with the staff, students and parents to create an original 90-minute performance. Every student and staff member will have an opportunity to be in the show. Your school will have a fantastic opportunity to learn new ways in which drama can be used in education. Your assemblies and concerts will never be the same. Choose Your Own Theme



Each Trickster School Residency is custom designed on a theme chosen in advance by the school staff. The chosen theme could relate to the Alberta curriculum, relevant events and issues in your community, or any other topic you choose. Past themes have included: Celebrating Science, Great Stories from Around the World, Expeditions, Medieval Life, Living History, Alberta's Centennial, Reaching for Excellence, Character Counts, How Medicine Hat got it's name, and Math Mania.

Performances on Friday night.



Following a week of workshops, lectures, demonstrations, and rehearsals, one or two Grand Finale performances are staged on Friday for the whole community. A variety of performance styles are incorporated: giant puppets, shadow screen, black light, dance, physical comedy, work with props, and choral work.

School sizes have ranged from 60 to 500 students. Your community will be amazed at what is created in a week.

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Up to \$15,000 AFA Funding Available



Financial assistance is available from the Alberta Foundation for the Arts. Calgary and Edmonton area schools* may apply for 50% of the Trickster fee. All other schools may apply for 75% of the fee. There is only one application deadline per year - April 1. The maximum grant available is \$15,000. In most cases the cost of a residency - per student - is less than the cost of a one day field trip.

What a Residency Looks Like



Monday morning at 7:30 we load in all of our props, costumes, lighting and sound. We meet with staff and have an assembly for the whole school. Then the workshops take place, with each class having one each day from Monday to Thursday. Our parent co-ordinator works with the parent team to sew costumes, make props, and help with scripting. Thursday afternoon and Friday morning we add lights, sound effects and music. Then it's show time - Friday afternoon for students, and Friday night for parents.

What We Bring to Your School



Curtains: Floor to ceiling curtains to transform the gym and provide entrances and exits.
Lights: Lighting trees, dimmer packs, and lights.
Sound: Wireless mics, mixers, computer sound effects, drums, keyboard, and of course - great speakers.
Costumes: hundreds of multi-purpose costumes.
Props: All the props for the styles that we use - pool noodles, bamboo poles, giant leaves, fun fur, bathroom plungers,...and more!

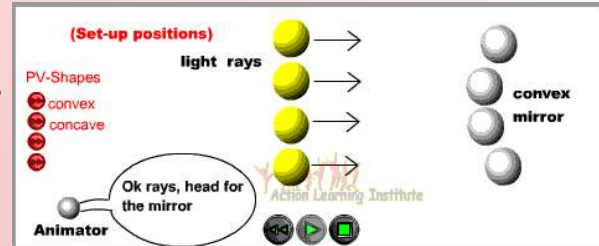
